The internationally renowned evangelist Billy Graham died on 21st February 2018. He is said to have preached to over 200 million people in 185 countries, including beyond the Iron Curtain, and in China and North Korea. He was not afraid to defend biblical values or to defy the racial segregation of the time, yet he managed to gain respect and influence across the secular world. He advised several American presidents and had spent time with Winston Churchill and Her Majesty the Queen. He famously paraphrased D.L. Moody, saying, "Someday you will read or hear that Billy Graham is dead. Don't you believe a word of it. I shall be more alive than I am now. I will just have changed my address. I will have gone into the presence of God." This indeed should be the attitude of every Christian, whose earthly life is only the beginning of an everlasting life before God's throne. In spite of this truth, we who are left behind feel a void left in our lives when we lose a Christian friend or relative. And in the case of a prominent pastor, it may be tempting to think, There will never be another one like him, or, We will never see times like that again. Nevertheless, though it is appropriate to delight in God's use of flawed vessels, we must always remember that He is never dependent on them to achieve His will. God's will cannot be thwarted and He will have the earth filled with the knowledge of His glory as waters cover the sea (Habakkuk 2:14). So let us be encouraged and pray that God would raise up more great men in our age.
